Academic Council Meeting 2018-19

❖ Prayer and Welcome:

The Academic Council meeting was conducted on 16th March, 2019 in the IQAC Hall. It commenced at 10 a.m. with a prayer led by Sr.P.Sunila Rani and Dr.A.Nirmala Jyothsna. Sr.Showrilu, the Vice Principal offered the formal welcome.

❖ Presentation of Report of College activities:

Dr.Sr.Mercy P, Principal presented a brief report of the College activities of the academic year 2018-19.

❖ Ratification of Results:

Sr.P.Sunila Rani, the Controller of Examinations and the Secretary of the Academic Council invited Dr.M.Padmaja, Lecturer in Home Science to present the results of the 2017-18 which was ratified by the Council.

❖ Ratification of Boards of Studies (UG) Resolutions:

Sr.P.Sunila Rani, the Secretary of the Academic Council and Controller of Examinations invited the Chairpersons of various Boards of Studies to present the resolutions of their particular boards. Each Chairperson of the UG Courses presented the resolutions after which the Academic Council members asked for clarifications if any or made suggestions, followed by the resolutions were ratified.

Dr.Y.Srinivasa Rao from Adikavi Nannaya University suggested to start coaching for Civils, so that the admission for History and other Social Sciences can be increased.

❖ Ratification of Boards of Studies (B.Voc.Courses) Resolutions:

The Chairpersons of B.Voc. Courses presented the resolutions of their Boards of Studies which after a long discussion was ratified.

The members at length discussed the practical problems encountered in delivering the curriculum, evaluation pattern, credits, job opportunities and other such matters. Dr.Y.Srinivasa Rao, Adikavi Nannaya University, Rajamahendravaram focused on the need for a common method of evaluation and assessment etc in the absence of which it becomes very difficult for the University particularly regarding Non-autonomous Colleges.

❖ Ratification Boards of Studies (Community College Courses) Resolutions:

The Chairpersons of Community College presented the resolutions of the Boards of Community College courses and it was ratified.

❖ Ratification regarding Bonus marks as Incentives for Co-curricular and Extra-curricular competitions:

The Principal presented the proposal for incentive in the form of marks for students who participate in co-curricular and extra-curricular competitions at Inter University/State/National/International levels. The proposal was discussed at length.

“It was ratified to pass the proposal for providing incentive in the form of marks for students who participate and win prizes in Sports and Games/ NCC/NSS/Cultural/Other extra-curricular activities at the University/Inter University/State/National/International levels.

- The Semester in which the student participated / won prize in the event the percentage of incentive marks will be added for all subjects of the particular Semester.

- To claim the benefit a student has to submit the certificate/proof duly signed by the Staff in-charge. The Examination Committee and Curriculum Development Committee jointly will finalize the incentive marks.
- In case there arise a tie for I Rank with another regular student the decision of the Joint Committee of Examination and Curriculum Development stands as final.

❖ Resolutions regarding Credit Transfer Mobility for MOOCs Courses:

The Principal placed before the Academic Council the proposal of Credit Transfer for MOOCs courses offered on SWAYAM and other platforms approved by the Curriculum Development Committee of the College. Credit transfer mobility is to be permitted as per UGC credit frame work. The College has registered as a Partner for distant learning with Indian Institute of Remote Sensing (IIRS), Dehradun. The students can take courses from this platform with prior approval as Add-on courses or Elective under CBCS.

“It was resolved to permit Credit Transfer for MOOCs courses which are approved by the Curriculum Development Committee of the College based on a prefixed course duration and credits”.

❖ Resolutions regarding New Courses:

The proposal to start new courses, in UG and PG was placed before the Academic Council. It is proposed to start St.Theresa’s ALS IAS academy; B.A. HEP – 3 year integrated IAS program from the academic year 2019-20. It is also proposed to start New Courses - M.Sc. Statistics; M.Com.; BBA – Aviation Management and B.Voc. Horticulture in the coming years.

❖ Any other:

Dr.Karuna Sree, Principal Scientist, Y.S.R.Horticulture University, appreciated the efforts of the College Management in bringing Credit transfer program and other

internship program done in collaboration with Krishi Vignan Kendra. She promised to collaborate further in extending similar programs to other courses related to their specialization.

Dr.K.Sree Ramesh expressed the anguish about the lack of takers for certain social science subjects at the University. He led the discussion on how it could be resolved. All the members actively participated in the discussion.

Dr.Fr.Kishore appreciated the innovative ideas and fresh changes brought about in curriculum by the College.

Dr.Y.Srinivasa Rao discussed various issues related to the vocationalization of education and the need for setting common standards across the State. The members discussed at length the embedded apprenticeship program suggested by the Government.

❖ Students Response:

Ms.P.Priyanka of III BBA thank the College for the opportunities provided to inculcate the administrative skills and the wide range of curriculum that has helped us to develop ourselves.

Ms.A.L.S.Soumya of II B.A. expressed her views about the curriculum that it is productive and it is relevant to the needs of the time.

The meeting came to a close with the vote of thanks proposed by Mrs.Ume Salma, Head of the Department of Telugu and Hindi.
